Elective Module: Preparation of Medicolegal Injury Report **Preparation of Medicolegal Injury Report**

Introduction

All Doctors working in hospitals encounter medicolegal issues which should be handled in accordance with the law of the land.

Medicolegal cases (MLC) are an integral part of medical practice that is frequently encountered by Medical Officers (MO). The occurrence of MLCs is on the increase. Proper handling and accurate documentation of these cases is of prime importance to avoid legal complications and to ensure that the patient or Next of Kin receive the entitled benefits.

All doctors should understand the medicolegal aspects related to documentation of Medicolegal Injury report as per the law of the land.

WHAT IS AN INJURY REPORT? Injury report is a kind of medicolegal report.

WHAT IS A MEDICOLEGAL CASE? A Medicolegal case is a case of injury or ailment where attending doctor after taking history and clinical examination of the patient thinks that some investigations by law enforcing agencies are essential so as to fix the responsibility regarding the case.

As an undergraduate medical student, learning about Medico Legal Injury Report writing shall provide a strong foundation in documentation of medicolegal reports as well as appropriate handling of medicolegal cases.
