Seminar on

Chronic Kidney Disease & Continuous Ambulatory Peritoneal Dialysis (CAPD)

February 2007

DMCH and Physicians Forum, Ludhiana organised a seminar on CAPD at Dumra Auditorium on 28th Jan, 2007.

At the seminar Dr. Vivekanand Jha, Associate Professor, Dept. of Nephrology at PGI Chandigarh was the main speaker. Dr. Jha informed that CAPD is a novel form of Dialysis, which can be performed by the patients without getting admitted to the hospital. This treatment is a boon for the patients coming from a distance and those with concomitant heart disease. In such cases, it forms a good alternative to kidney transplant, which is more expensive. Also, large number of patients are unfit for transplant or do not have a kidney donor.

Dr. Jha along with Dr. Navdeep Khaira and Dr. J.S. Sandhu gave advice on early detection and prevention of kidney disease, type of treatment available and dietary advice for such patients.





Breast Cancer

Q:1 What are the warning signs for Breast Cancer?

Ans: Lump in Breast
Nipple Retraction
Abnormal discharge from Nipple
Thickening of Breast Skin

Q:2 What is the etiology of Breast Cancer?

Ans: Exact etiology is unknown. However, numerous risk factors have been established—Female gender, increasing age, family history of breast cancer at a young age, early menarchy, late menopause, older age at first live child birth, prolonged hormone replacement therapy, previous chest wall irradiation, benign proliferative breast disease and mutations in the genes BRCA-1 and BRCA-2.

Q:3 How can breast cancer be diagnosed early?

Ans: a) Breast self examination once a month.

b) Examination by specialist once in six months.

c) Mammography in high risk cases.

Q:4 What investigations are required to diagnose breast cancer?

Ans: After clinical examination of both breasts and axillae-

 a) In case of palpable breast lump - FNAC or core biopsy.

 In case of non palpable breast lump - Mammography followed by fine needle aspiration cytology.

Q:5 What are the treatment options for breast cancer?

Ans: Surgery followed by chemotherapy or radiotherapy or both and hormonal therapy, according to the stage of the disease.

Q:6 Does breast cancer occur in men?

Ans: Yes, breast cancer can occur in men but the incidence is quite less.

Q:7 What is the treatment for male breast cancer?

Ans: Surgery followed by chemotherapy, radiotherapy and hormonal therapy, is generally carried out.

Q:8 What facilities are available for treatment of breast cancer at DMCH?

Ans: Expertise and all medical and surgical facilities are available in the institution. State-of-the-art Cancer Centre is on the anvil, including radiotherapy.
