# **Papers Presented/Guest Lectures**

## National Orthopaedic Conference, Kolkata, 25th Dec.

Dr. JL Bassi "Management of Proximal Numerous Fractures." Elderly population has increasing magnitude of proximal humerus fractures. The latest technique available for managing these fractures were discussed.

Dr. Pankaj Mahindra "Management of Proximal Tibia Fractures with IM Nail."

Proximal tibial fractures have been conventionally managed with plate & screws which require a lot of soft tissue dissection. Intramedullary (IM) nail implantation can be performed with minimal soft tissue damage and early patient mobilization.

## PAFMATCON, 2007, Banur, 6th Dec.

Dr. Varinder Pal Singh "A Ten Year Study of Poisoning Cases in Tertiary Care Hospital"

Incidence of deaths due to poisoning was found to be persistently increasing. Suicide was the most common (93%) mode of poisoning. Aluminium phosphide was found to be the 'Poison of choice' amongst suicides.

It was suggested that all the hospitals have a separate toxicology unit dealing exclusively with the poison cases

directly under the supervision of the toxicologist. Storage and sale of insecticides should be controlled through strict rules & regulations. 'Over the counter' sale of insecticides should be banned.

### ASICON 2007, Bhubaneshwar 25-29 Dec.

Dr. PS Nain: "Abdominal Wall Mucormycosis"—A Case Report

Mucormycosis is caused by a group of ubiquitous saprophytic fungi with a low intrinsic pathogenicity but can cause fatal infection in the immunocompromised host. They rarely infect the healthy host. A case of 35 yrs old female presenting with necrotizing fasciatis who had severe abdominal wall invasive mucormycosis after open cholecystectomy was presented.

Extensive serial debridements with wide excision and subsequent reconstruction of the anterior chest and abdominal wall with ipsilateral latissismus dorsi flap and split skin grafting was done. The patient recovered uneventfully.

The equipment is used to monitor pressure and flow in the lower urinary tract. Its helps to assess urethral obstruction, neurogenic bladder and non-specific lower UTI symptoms.

Using urodynamic studies, it can be differentiated whether patient needs surgery or only medical treatment.



## WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

#### BENIGN PROSTATIC HYPERTROPHY

Dr. Sandeep Sharma, Prof. & Head, Dept. Of Urology

- Q. Is the enlarged prostate some sort of disease?
- Ans. No. It is just a process of growing old. Most men above 60 would have some symptoms of enlarged prostate.
- Q. What is the common presentation of patient with enlarged prostate?
- Ans. The patient may complain of passing urine too frequently. They usually complain of thin, forceless urinary stream. He may also be getting up frequently to void during sleep at night.
- Q. Does inability to empty bladder completely or inability to hold urination for long time indicate enlarged prostate?
- Ans. Yes , these may be the presenting symptoms in some patients.
- Q. How does a patient present in severe problem?
- Ans. A patient may present with retention of urine or blood in urine.
- Q. What investigations are important in such patient population?
- Ans. American Urological Association recommends Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) as the most important and mandatory test. An ultrasonic examination of kidneys, bladder and prostate along with determination of residual urine after urination is important. Further information can be obtained from urodynamic studies.
- Q. What is the role of urodynamic evaluation in enlarged prostate?
- Ans. Patients with irritative symptoms, (particularly frequency) are ideal candidates for pressure flow studies. It is available at DMCH
- Q. Is the treatment for enlarged prostate always surgical?
- Ans. Not really. Medical treatment helps in mild to moderate cases though Endoscopic Surgery is needed in severe cases.
- Q. Is Trans Uretheral Resection of Prostate (TURP) a major surgery?
- Ans. Yes, it is a major surgery, but modern endoscopic techniques ensures a very quick recovery. Total hospitalization is of three to four days only. Blood transfusion may occasionally be required. It is a routine procedure done at DMCH.
- Q. Does prostate surgery affect sexual life of the patient?
- Ans. No, TURP does not affect sexual performance, though the semen volume may become less.
- Q. What facilities are available at DMCH for the treatment of enlarged prostate?
- Ans. DMCH is equipped with state-of-the-art equipment for investigations including Urodynamic Machine. It has the best possible expertise and surgical facilities for the same. A special Neuro-Urology clinic is run once a week. Most of the




# NAUGURATION OF URODYNAMIC MACHINE
