



Fundus Fluorescein Angiography (Digital Unit)

This equipment installed recently in the Eye Department is a high end Carl-Zeiss Unit enables report of various retinal and choroidal diseases immediately. It can compare disc profile for diagnosing glaucoma patients. Follow-up of glaucoma patients is also carried out.





Pain Management

Dr. Suneet Kathuria (Anaesthesia) has been awarded the 'Aesculap Academy Fellowship in Pain Management' at Delhi. The course was held under the expert guidance of Prof. GP Dureja. The following techniques for the amelioration of acute and chronic pain are being carried out at DMCH. Stellate Ganglion Block, Celiac Plexus Block, Lumbar Sympathetic Plexus Block, Trigeminal Nerve Block and Obturator & Posterior Tibial Nerve Block in Cerebral Palsy, Transforaminal Root Sleeve Block, Facet Block, Facet Rhizotomy, Caudal Epidural Block and Ozone Discectomy for low back ache.

Other high-tech techniques being used are Implantation of Intrathecal Drug Delivery System, Spinal Cord Stimulation, Patient Controlled Analgesia and Radiofrequency Ablation.





WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

OVERACTIVE BLADDER

Dr. Baldev Singh Aulakh, Professor of Urology, Head Transplant Unit

Q. What is an overactive bladder (OAB) and how common is it? Ans. An overactive bladder is a condition that results from sudden involuntary contraction of the muscles of the urinary bladder wall, causing a sudden and unstoppable need to urinate (urinary urgency).

Prevalence of overactive bladder is 9-16% of the population.

What are the symptoms of overactive bladder?

Ans. Frequent urination, urgency of urination and urge incontinence. There may also be significant associated social, psychological, occupational, domestic, physical and sexual problems.

What are the conditions that mimic OAB?

Benian hypertrophy of the prostate

Carcinoma Bladder (Carcinoma in situ)

How is an OAB managed?

Ans. There are several options available for its management.

Pelvic muscle-exercises Kegel exercises

Biofeedback

Vaginal weight training

Pelvic floor electrical stimulation

Behavioral therapies Bladder training Toileting assistance

Surgery

What are the medications used to improve incontinence medically?

Oxybutynin, Tolterodine and Derafanacin, Estrogen Ans. Other drugs: alpha-antagonists, beta adrenergic agonists, PG synthesis inhibitors.

Intravesical agents: Vanilloids and botulinum toxin.

What are the surgical options available for the treatment of overactive bladder?

Ans. Neural stimulation/modulation Detrusor myectomy

Cystoplasty

What facilities are available at DMCH?

Ans. Comprehensive medical and surgical care including urodynamic evaluation is being offered to patients with OAB.
