A DXA Scan is used to measure the density of bones. It is mainly used to diagnose osteoporosis (loss of bone material) and to assess the risk of having a fracture. It is a fast, accurate and painless procedure and the dose of radiation used is extremely low.

DXA uses low energy x-ray which are blocked by bone. Two x-ray beams with differing energy levels are aimed at the patient's bones. BMD can be determined from the absorption of each beam by bone. The test is very reliable.










WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

DXA SCAN

Q. What is a DXA scan and what does it measure?

A. DXA (earlier called DEXA) stands for 'dual energy x-ray absorptiometry' and it measures Bone Mineral Density (BMD).

Q. How is DXA scan done?

A. The patient lies on his back on a couch and is asked to keep still while the 'scanner' comes over the area to be tested.

Q. Is it a painful procedure?

A. No, it is not a painful procedure.

Q. How much time does it take?

A. It takes approximately 10-15 minutes.

Q. Is there any special preparation required prior to the

A. No special preparation is required prior to a DXA scan.

Q. Who should have a DXA scan?

A. Bone density testing is strongly recommended in:

- post-menopausal woman not taking estrogen.
- personal or maternal history of hip fracture.
- medications that are known to cause bone loss e.g. steroid.
- type1 diabetes, liver/kidney disease.
- family history of osteoporosis.
- hyperthyroidism or thyroid replacement medication.
- fracture after only mild trauma.
- h/o intake of excessive alcohol, smoking.

Q. How are the results interpreted?

The test results are in the form of

T-score: T-score indicates the bone density as follows-

- Greater than -1 = normal BMD (Bone Mineral Density)
- Between -1 and -2.5 = low BMD (Osteopenia)
- -2.5 or lower = osteoporosis

Z-score: Z-score indicates the amount of bone a person has, compared with other people in same age group and of the same size and gender.

Q. Is DXA scan available in DMCH?

A. Yes, it is available under the Departments of Radiology and Endocrinology, and is done on OPD Basis.
