CME on Problem Oriented Learning in Physiology and Biochemistry

Physiotherapy students and delegates including orthopaedicians, neurologists and neurosurgeons from various institutions of the region attended the workshop, inaugurated by the Secretary, DMCH Managing Society, Sh. Prem Kumar Gupta.

Detailed discussions on the normal and abnormal walking patterns and their respective clinical evaluation and treatment were elaborated upon alongwith relevant practical sessions. Lectures were held on the gait cycle and muscle functions, functional foot disorders and common injuries like lower extremity pathologies. Abnormal gait may be caused by diseases including vestibular disorders, central nervous system disorders, peripheral nerve and degenerative muscle diseases, arthritis, foot conditions and toxic reactions (alcohol, drugs, allergens). The guest speakers included Ms Naomi Green from UK and Dr. Gagan Kapoor, Physiotherapist, National Football Team, Delhi.



Cross Consultation Desk

The resident/ward sister informs the cross consultation desk by phone regarding the details of the patient and the cross consultation sought. The desk clerk notes the relevant information from different areas/wards of the hospital and coordinates with the concerned consultants and ward sisters to streamline timely and efficient cross-consultation services to the patient.

Upto 140 calls are being received and co-ordinated by this desk daily.

Tips for weight loss

- Use a quarter plate for dinner. Reducing the plate size by only 10% in diameter can reduce the amount of food you eat by a
- Drop your car keys, walk... Walking 70 steps/min burns 5 calories each minute. By continuous walk for 30 minutes each day, five days a week, you lose up to 3000 calories a month.
- Three 10 minute sessions of brisk walking in a day are as good as one 30 minute session.
- By eliminating 250 calories a day from food and shedding. another 250 through exercise, you can lose half a kilogram per week. Half a Kg body weight is equivalent to 3500 calories.

WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

Bariatric Surgery

Q. What is bariatric surgery?

It is also known as weight loss surgery and refers to various surgical procedures performed to treat obesity by modification of the gastrointestinal tract to reduce nutrient intake and/or absorption. The term does not include procedures for surgical removal of body fat such as liposuction or abdominoplasty.

Q. Who needs bariatric surgery?

Obese individuals who have been unable to achieve significant weight loss through diet modification and exercise programs alone.

What is body mass index (BMI)? How is obesity calculated?

BMI=weight in kg/height in meters2 (by quetelets index). Obesity is calculated by BMI; underweight <18.5; normal 18.5-25; overweight 25-27; mild obesity 27-30; moderate obesity >30; severe obesity >35; morbid obesity >40; super obesity >50.

Q. Are there any health hazards of obesity?

Obesity damages the body by its mechanical, metabolic and psychophysiological adverse effects on normal body function.

Q. Are there any selection criteria for obesity surgery?

BMI>40, BMI>35 with co-morbidity (hypertension, type 2 diabetes mellitus, sleep apnoea, reflux, dyslipidemia etc.)

Q. What are the types of obesity surgery?

A. 1. Restrictive

Laproscopic adjustable gastric banding

Sleeve gastrectomy

Malabsorptive

Roux-en-Y gastric bypass

Bilio-pancreatic diversion (BPD)

BPD with duodenal switch.

Q. Is the bariatric surgery safe for the patient?

Complication rate is as low as 0.35%.

Q. What defines successful weight loss surgery?

A. The ability to achieve and maintain loss of at least 50% of excess body weight without having substantial adverse effects.

What other specialities are involved with bariatric surgery?

It is a multidisciplinary team approach which includes anaesthesiologists. plastic surgeon, pulmonologists, cardiologists, dietician, endocrinologists and psychotherapists.

Q. What is the diet after bariatric surgery?

We recommend a diet that is relatively high in protein and low in carbohydrates and alcohol. Post surgery, overeating is curbed because exceeding the capacity of the stomach causes nausea and vomiting, thus patients cannot eat a large quantity of food.

Q. Are these surgeries being done in DMCH?

Yes, facilities for bariatric surgery are available in DMCH. Several successful surgeries have been carried out and many more are scheduled in the near future.
