#### Pulse Polio Campaign


3766 children were covered under the Pulse Polio Campaign which was supervised by Dr. Sunil Kuamr Juneja (Obst & Gynae).

#### Free Eye Camp


Free Eye Camp was conducted in the DMC Eye OPD in which 14 patients were examined and 12 refractions and 1 surgery was performed.

#### WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

#### 'Osteoporosis'

#### Q. What is Osteoporosis?

A. Osteoporosis is low bone density characterized by deterioration in bone microarchitecture and reduced bone strength. WHO defines Osteoporosis as BMD 2.5 Standard Deviations (SD) or more below the mean for young adults (i.e. T Score -2.5).

#### Q. What are the symptoms?

A. It is called Silent Thief as the majority of patients have no symptoms till they suffer fragility fracture of the Hip, wrist, ribs or spine. The patients may sometimes complain of bony pains, aches, backache and tiredness. Some of the patients (elderly ladies) present with hunchback.

#### Q. Is Osteoporosis common?

A. It is so common that 1 out of 8 males and 1 out of 3 females in India suffer from Osteoporosis making India one of the largest affected countries with about 36 million patients of Osteoporosis in 2013. In India, there is high incidence among men and lower age of peak incidence which is very disturbing trend.

#### Q. What are risk factors?

A. Sedentary life style, smoking, dietary deficiency, family history, menopause and age are major risk factors. Other factors, which cause osteoporosis, include steroid use, thyroid disease, alcoholism and malignant disease.

#### Q. Is Osteoporosis preventable?

A. Osteoporosis can be prevented but the efforts have to begin in childhood to achieve good Peak Bone Mass. We should encourage regular exercise, nutritious balanced diet with calcium and Vitamin D supplementation. Smoking, alcohol, steroids should be avoided. One should also aim for good control of thyroid disorder.

#### Q. How is Osteoporosis diagnosed?

A. Osteoporosis is diagnosed from good clinical history (bony pains) and examination and confirmed by DEXA (Dual Energy X-ray Absorbtiometry). Serum calcium, VIT D levels should also be done.

#### Q. Is it treatable?

A. Osteoporosis is treatable. The management involves regular physical activity or exercise, balanced diet, calcium and Vit D supplements. We also have different drugs to decrease the loss of bone architecture and hormonal supplements to increase bone mass in severe cases.

#### O. What facilities are available at DMCH?

A. DMC & Hospital has DEXA Scan, Serum calcium, Vit D levels monitoring facilities. In addition, collaborative effort of Orthopedics and Endocrinology department provides the best care to patients of Osteoporosis. The Hospital also has facilities and is providing the state of art treatment for Osteoporotic fractures especially hip fractures. The hospital also has Senior citizen cell.
