The incidence and prevalence of fungal rhinosinusites (FRS) is increasing leading to serious



complications, if not treated in time. In this study, 64% patients presented with non-invasive fungal rhino-sinusites, whereas 36.7% presented with invasive fungal rhinosinusites. The most common fungus isolated was Aspergillus spp (68%). [Pic. K]





WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

Lab diagnosis of Fungal Infections

Dr. Deepinder Chhina, Professor of Microbiology

Q. What are the frequently encountered fungal infections?

A. Dermatophytoses, Fungal Rhinosinusitis (FRS), Fungemia, Fungal meningitis, Fungal pneumonia, Allergic Broncho-pulmonary Aspergillosis (ABPA), Mycotic keratitis etc. are frequently seen.

Q. What are the most common aetiological agents?

- A. Trichophyton rubrum, Microsporum canis, T. tonsurans, T. mentagrophytes and Epidermophyton floccosum are commonest in Dermatophytoses.
 - Candida spp, Aspergillus spp, Malassezia spp, Trichosporon spp and Paecilomyces spp. are isolated more frequently from blood.
 - Aspergillus spp, Mucor spp, Rhizopus spp, Curvularia spp, Bipolaris spp. and Pseudoallescheria boydii cause fungal rhino sinusitis (FRS).
 - Cryptococcus neoformans, Candida albicans, Histoplasma capsulatum and Coccidioides immitis are responsible for meningitis.

Q. What are the different samples collected for the diagnosis of Dermatophytoses?

A. Skin, hair and nail are usually taken for diagnosis of Dermatophytoses. Skin scrapings, nail clippings (discoloured, dystrophic or brittle part of nail and plucked hair), should be paced in sterile petri dish or paper envelope.

Q. What are the different techniques employed for diagnosis of Dermatophytoses in the Microbiology lab?

- Direct microscopic examination of the KOH mount demonstrating the causative pathogen.
- Isolation of the fungus on Sabouraud Dextrose Agar with Antibiotics & Cyclohexamide, which takes about 3 weeks.

Q. Can the Automated Blood culture system available in Microbiology department be useful for Laboratory Diagnosis of Fungemia.

A. Yes, by inoculating 5-10 ml of Blood in Myco/F Lytic bottles of Bactec System. Multiple blood cultures at timed interval can improve the sensitivity.

Q. How should the biopsy sample be sent for Microbiological studies?

A. Biopsy should be sent in a sterile container with 2-3 ml of sterile normal saline or Brain-Heart Infusion (BHI) broth. Biopsy sent in formalin is unacceptable for mycological studies.

Q. Which is the relative value of tests for the diagnosis of Cryptococcal Meningitis?

A. Latex agglutination Test (Sensitivity & Specifiity 95- 100%) is the most sensitive test for the diagnosis of Cryptococcal Meningitis. The Sensitivity of India ink preparation & Culture is only 50-70% & 20-30% respectively.

Q. What is the significance of isolation of Candida from respiratory samples?

A. Recovery of Candida from respiratory tract usually indicates colonization rather than infection. The only sure method to establish that Candida is the primary lung pathogen is to demonstrate yeast or pseudohyphae in a lung biopsy along with inflammation.

Q. What are the facilities available at DMCH for diagnosing fungal infections?

 The facilities available at DMCH for diagnosing fungal infection include microscopy and culture by automated and conventional methods.
