

WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

Childhood Nephrotic Syndrome

O. What are the diagnostic features of Nephrotic Syndrome (NS)?

A. Nephrotic Syndrome is characterized by heavy proteinuria, Hypoalbuminemia (serum albumin < 2.5g/dl), hyperlipidemia (serum cholesterol > 200 mg/dl) and edema. Urine protein 3+/4+ on a dipstick test, spot protein/creatinine ratio > 2 or urine albumin > 40 mg/m2/h (on a timed sample).

Q. What is the cause of Nephrotic Syndrome in children?

A. The condition is primary (idiopathic) in 95% cases. In others, the underlying cause may be Systematic Lupus Erythematosus, Henoch Schonlein Purpura and infections like HIV, hepatitis B and C.

About 90% of idiopathic cases have 'minimal lesion' on histology and respond promptly to corticosteroid therapy. The remaining is contributes by focal segmental glomerulosclerosis (FSGC) and mesangioproliferative glomerulonephritis (MesPGN)

Q. What can be the complications of Childhood NS?

A. Infection is commonest, followed by thromboembolic events. Hypertension, Hyperlipidaemia, corticosteroid toxicity and behavioural disorders are less frequent.

Q. Do all patients require renal biopsy?

A. Renal biopsy is required in steroid resistance (no response within 4 weeks), age < 1 or > 15 yr, or if secondary causes are considered. A biopsy should be performed before starting cyclosporin.

Q. What is the standard treatment schedule for childhood nephrotic syndrome?

A. The Expert Group of the Indian Pediatric Nephrology Group recommends treatment of the initial episode with prednisolone 2 mg/kg (max 60 mg) in 2-3 divided doses daily for 6 weeks, followed by 1.5 mg/kg (max 40 mg) as a single morning dose on alternate days for next 6 weeks.

Q. What are the medications for unsatisfactory response to steroids?

A. Levamisole, cyclophosphamide, cyclosporine and mycophenolate are beneficial in a variable proportion of patients with frequent relapses or steroid dependence.

Q. What is the prognosis of children with Nephrotic syndrome?

A. More than 70% of children with steroid-sensitive nephrotic syndrome relapse and almost 50% have frequent relapses or steroid dependence. Their risk for progression to chronic failure is minimal.

Q. What is the outcome of Steroid Resistant Nephrotic Syndrome (SRNS)?

A. In a small proportion of steroid resistant cases, Calcineurin inhibitors (cyclosporine, tacrolimus), mucophenolate, IV steroids (with alkylating agents) are capable of inducing remission in a significant proportion. In those who fail to respond, outcome is unsatisfactory with a risk of higher complications, progressive kidney disease and end stage renal failure.

Q. Do we have special clinics at DMCH to deal with children with Nephrotic Syndrome?

A. Yes, there is Nephrology Clinic in the Pediatric OPD every Monday for children with nephrotic syndrome and other renal disorders.
