

Dr. Puneet Pooni (Pediatrics) participated as faculty in a Workshop on Pediatric Mechanical ventilation organized by Intensive Care Chapter, Punjab at Apollo Hospital, Ludhiana. She delivered a talk on "Weaning from ventilator" and conducted a workshop session on "Management of obstructive lung disease".

Mechanical ventilation is the major intervention to prevent morbidity and death from respiratory failure. Average PICU has >30% patients on mechanical ventilation for a mean of 5-6 days. Prolonged ventilation is associated with nosocomial pneumonia, ventilator induced lung injury, cardiac associated morbidity and upper airway problems. But extubation failure and premature discontinuation of mechanical ventilation increases stay in PICU and costs. Optimal weaning would mean minimizing the duration of mechanical ventilation without incurring risk of reintubation to prevent complications.

Artificial Cervical Disc Arthroplasty





The modality of microscopic discectomy and artificial disc replacement is now available to patients at DMCH in the deptt. of Neurosurgery. This technique incorporates a new artificial disc, designed to alleviate neck pain associated with disc herniations, spinal arthritis and spine degenerative conditions, and also permits more motion of the neck.

Dr. HS Bains (Pediatrics) stressed on prevention of asthmatic attacks especially in pregnant mothers and an aggressive & optimal management of exacerbations as about 1% of pregnancies are complicated by asthma.

Dr. Anil Kashyap (Chest) said that the important contributing factors for poor asthma control were delayed diagnosis, under-assessment and under-treatment of disease. Myths, inadequate information and lack of awareness make people neglect the disease.





WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

Cervical Spondylosis

Q. What is meant by cervical spondylosis?

A. The term "spondylosis" refers to a degenerative condition where the vertebrae gradually form bone spurs and their shock absorbing disc slowly shrinks with age.

Q. What causes cervical spondylosis?

A. Cervical spondylosis can be caused by a slipped disc or a bony overgrowth or a combination of both.

Q. How does cervical spondylosis manifest?

A. One of the commonest complaints is neck pain which would be noted on neck movement or on coughing or sneezing.

Q. What are the investigations required for cervical spondylosis?

A. If there are no major signs or symptoms of neurological dysfunction, the patient may not need any investigations.

If indicated, plain x-rays of the spine may be ordered with or without blood investigations such as hemoglobin, ESR, CRP, RA test, serum calcium phosphorus and alkaline phosphatase.

Sometimes, in the presence of significant signs or symptoms, the patient may need MRI scanning. In some cases such as peripheral neuropathy or thoracic outlet syndrome, EMG-NCV test may be needed.

Q. Is there any non-surgical treatment for cervical spondylosis?

A. The type of treatment depends on the duration of the problem. Various non-operative means of treatment include painkillers, muscle relaxants, heat and electrical stimulation, cervical traction and activity restriction.

Q. When is surgery essential?

A. Surgery would be indicated when there is no relief of pain despite symptomatic treatment or, when there is significant neurological deficit or, repeated episodes of pain.

Q. What is the nature of surgery?

A. Microdiscectomy is the usual surgery for cervical spondylosis and is performed through the microscope. It is a relatively safe procedure. When many levels are involved, the surgery may be done from the behind, otherwise, it would be from the front.

O. What are the newer advances in the treatment of this condition?

- A. i. Microscopic discectomy: Allows good depth perception and is very safe.
 - ii. Percutaneous laser discectomy: It is not considered to be scientifically more superior to microdiscectomy.
 - iii. Artificial disc arthroplasty: The intervertebral disc is replaced by an artificial one.

O. Are these facilities available at DMCH?

A. Yes, facilities for microscopic discectomy and artificial disc replacement are available in the department of Neurosurgery.
