Rare Laparoscopic Bilateral Adrenalectomy

A rare Laparoscopic bilateral adrenalectomy was performed by Dr Baldev Singh Aulakh and his team on a 18 year old patient who was diagnosed to have Bilateral Primary Nodular Hyperplasia



and Cushing's Syndrome. Laparoscopic adrenalectomy is technically more demanding but complication rates decrease with this procedure.

Dr Amarjit Kaur (Immunohaematology & Transfusion Medicine) delivered a guest lecture at Ludhiana on the occasion of Teacher's Day.

Dr Suman Puri (Obst & Gynae) was invited as a faculty in a group discussion on "Comprehensive endometriosis management" which included surgical approaches to endometriosis. Medical management of endometriosis, managing recurrent endometriosis, endometriosis in ART, and deep or recto vaginal endometriosis were discussed.

Endometriosis should be detected as early as possible as it is a recurrent condition which often leads to infertility.

Seminar on Diabetes & Obesity Surgery

A Seminar on "Diabetes and Obesity Surgery" was organised which was attended by around 100 overweight and diabetic patients. It was chaired by Dr Parminder Singh (Endocrinology) along with Dr PS Nain and Dr Ashish Ahuja (Surgery), Chief Dietician Mrs. Ritu Sudhakar and Dietician Shewta Bhat.

The DMC family bid adieu to **Dr N S Khaira**, Prof & Head of Nephrology. He served the institution for 19 years.



WITHATT YOU MUST KNOWY ABOUTT....

DEADDICTION

Dr Navkiran S Mahajan, Associate Professor, Dept of Psychiatry

Q. What is drug addiction?

A. Drug addiction is defined as the repeated & increased use of a drug, the deprivation of which gives rise to symptoms of distress and an irresistible urge to use the drug again and which leads to physical, mental and social deterioration.

Q. What are the common drugs causing addiction?

A. Tobacco, Alcohol, Cannabis, Opioids (opium, poppy husk, smack, heroin, cough syrups, fortwin), Pain killers, Cocaine, Inhalants, Benzodiazepines (eg. diazepam), Party drugs and Date Rape Drugs (LSD, GHB, Ketamine, Ecstacy, Rophynl, Ice)

Q. How common is drug addiction and do people become addicted to drugs?

A. The prevalence rate is about 28.77%. Drug availability, social acceptability and peer pressure initiate experimentation with the drug but psychological factors like personality and individual biology are instrumental in having dependence.

Q. What are the complications of drug addiction?

- A. a) Medical: Cancers oral, lung, gut and hepatic cancer; Cirrhosis; HIV, HCV and HBV infections.
 - b) Psychiatric (Present in >50%): Mood disorders esp. depressive, Anxiety disorders; Psychosis; Psychosexual and sleep disorders; Suicide.
 - Other: Increasing violence, crime and delinquent behaviours; Road side accidents.

Q. Can drug addiction be treated?

- A. Yes, a holistic treatment strategy is required which includes.
 - Motivation: to motivate the person to leave the drug and seek help.
 - 2. Detoxification: Reversal of short and long term neuroadaptive changes in the brain and body chiefly by pharmacological methods and psychotherapy.
 - 3. Relapse prevention: long term goal to prevent relapses. Done by a combination of pharmacological methods and psychotherapy.

Q. What about the highly publicized Painless One Day Detoxification Method?

A. These are hand alone therapies and such methods have not been approved or endorsed by any National & International regulatory and professional body. Moreover, they are not painless and are contra-indicated in multiple drug addiction.

Q. Is this facility available at DMCH?

A. All modalities of treatment e.g. counseling, and motivation, detoxification and relapse prevention (short & long term) are available in the Dept of Psychiatry. In addition, adjunctive treatments like Family and Marital therapy are also available.
