






The number of patients who reach hospital in time for thrombolysis is too low! Early recognition and reporting within 3-5 hours of developing stroke is required for good outcome using TPA.







WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

STROKE: Early treatment with TPA

Q. What is Stroke?

A. A stroke occurs when there is interruption of blood flow to one hemisphere of the brain leading to paralysis of the other side of the body. When there is stroke, brain cells in the immediate area begin to die because they stop getting oxygen and nutrients for normal function.

Q. Is stroke a common medical problem?

A. Stroke is the third leading cause of death in the developing countries and a leading cause of serious, long-term disability in adults.

Q. What are the cardinal symptoms of stroke?

A. Sudden weakness of one side of the body, numbness of the side, facial paralysis with weakness and/or sudden swaying on the other side. If patient has any of these symptoms, he/she should be referred to a definitive stroke care centre urgently and should be evaluated.

Q. What is TPA (Tissue Plasminogen Activator)?

A. Tissue Plasminogen Activator is a recombinant human type protein which helps in dissolution of clot and is the only FDA approved therapy for acute stroke. It helps in reperfusion and salvage the area at risk.

Q. How early should patient reach definitive care?

A. Stroke is an emergency. Only patients with acute stroke presenting to the emergency within the time window of THREE HOURS are eligible candidates for thrombolytic therapy. Recently this time window has been extended upto 5 hours.

Q. Why we need to act fast?

A. When patient has a stroke, every minute counts, because longer the flow is cut-off, the greater is the damage. With the centre ischemic core there is surrounding area of penumbra, which can be salvaged by restoration of blood flow with TPA. It helps in reducing the severity and disability of stroke significantly.

Q. What are the risks of TPA?

A. Bleeding (haemorrhage), in the brain or in other parts of the body, can occasionally occur. In 6 out of 100 patients treated within 3 hours, bleeding may occur into the brain and cause further injury.

Q. How is DMC geared up for thrombolysis?

A. The DMC Emergency has a stroke team that is led by a 24-hours on-call neurologist. Once the patient with stroke reaches the Emergency, the patient will be seen immediately by a neurologist and a CT scan or MRI and other blood tests will be undertaken. Following this, a decision to administer TPA or not will be taken, within 3 hrs of onset of symptoms.

Q. What is the "Take home message"?

A. Be Stroke Smart. Recognize the symptoms of stroke and report to the DMCH Emergency immediately or call
