WHAT YOU MUST KNOW ABOUT...

MICROTIA

O. What is microtia?

A. mictoria is a congenital malformation where the pinna of the year does not develop fully.

Q. What causes microtia?

A. The most probable cause is failure of development or loss of circulation in the stapedial artery in the fetus. It may be associated with Hemifacial Microsomia, Otomandibular syndrome, Treacher Collins syndrome, Goldenhar syndrome and Nager syndrome.

Q. Are patients with microtia able to hear?

A. Yes! In microtia, external auditory canal is absent and patients have conductive hearing loss. However in unilateral cases hearing is normal on the opposite side.

Q. What investigations are done?

A. Hearing Tests, 3-D CT Scan temporal bone to rule out cholesteatoma & to assess middle ear structures.

O. What is the treatment for microtia?

A. Ear is reconstructed in a three staged surgery. In first stage, costal cartilage is contoured to form the ear framework and is inserted at the normal position of ear. In second stage the ear lobule is rotated and in the third stage the ear is elevated to provide the normal projection.

Q. Can the conductive hearing loss associated with microtia be

A. The conductive hearing loss can be restored by a 2nd stage in surgery in which a new ear canal can be constructed. The assicles can be reconstructed or else prosthesis can be used.

Q. What is the timing of surgery?

A. It is usually performed between 8-10 years of age when the costal cartilages are sufficiently developed.

Q. Can this condition be treated medically?

A. No, the only remedy for this condition is surgical repair.

Q. Is the surgery performed in DMCH?

A. Yes. It is routinely performed in the Department of Plastic Surgery & Burns.
