


Dear Friends

Surgical intervention by minimally invasive procedure in dysfunction of joints prevents morbidity of the traditional open surgical procedures.


PULSE POLIO IMMUNIZATION CAMPAIGN


Chemotherapy at DMCH



**Hero DMC Heart Institute
Combo device implanted on 2 heart patients**

Cardiologists of the Hero DMC Heart Institute have implanted a 'Combo Device' on two heart patients. It is a total heart rhythm control device, which controls slow heart rate by dual chamber pacing, improves reduced heart pump by resynchronising cardiac rhythm.

This device provides electric stimulation to the heart and monitors the electrical activity of the heart for any potentially fatal rhythm abnormality. When the device detects such an abnormality, it delivers an electric shock to the heart, which brings the heart rhythms back to normal and saves the patient's life.

What You Must Know About ...

BONE MARROW TRANSPLANT

• **What is a stemcell?**

A cell morphologically similar to a lymphocyte which under special circumstances has the ability to produce differentiated cells is known as a stem cell. A stem cell can form neurons, liver cells, skeletal muscles, cardiac muscles. A 100 stem cells can rescue a lethally irradiated animal.

• **What is stemcell transplantation?**

It is a process of transplanting hematopoietic stem cells to form various organs like bone marrow, liver, brain, heart etc.

• **What is Bone Marrow Transplantation (BMT)?**

It is a technique where bone marrow stem cells are removed, stored and are transfused into a recipient after ablating his or her bone marrow with myeloablative chemotherapy.

• **What are the types of BMT?**

Autologous: patient himself is the donor

Allogenic: HLA matched sibling is the donor

• **What are the sources of stemcells?**

Bone marrow, peripheral blood & cord blood

• **What are the diseases treatable by BMT?**

Multiple Myeloma

Lymphomas

Leukemias

Inherited erythrocyte disorders: eg. Thalassemias,

Stem Cell Disorders: Aplastic Anemia, Fanconi's

Anemia, Paroxysmal Nocturnal Haemoglobinuria

Myeloproliferative disorders

Liposomal storage diseases:

Histiocytic disorders:

Congenital Immune disorders: eg. Ataxia

Telangiectasia

• **What was the type of BMT recently conducted at DMCH?**

The patient had Hodgkin's disease with front line induction failure to standard doses of chemotherapy. He underwent autologous peripheral blood stem cell transplant with successful outcome.
