


Dear Reader,

Cadaver Organ Donation and First-In-House Multi Organ Transplant

DMC&H has emerged as a leading centre in the region for promoting the noble cause of organ donation, working in close collaboration with SOTTO (State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization) to ensure ethical and timely allocation of organs. Each successful donation not only brings renewed hope to recipients and their families but also honors the selfless legacy of the donors and their courageous families.

We have successfully retrieved multiple organs (Liver, Kidneys, Pancreas & Comeas) from 5 cadaveric organ donors. These donations have provided a second chance of life to numerous patients suffering from end-stage organ failure and highlight the hospital's robust infrastructure, skilled transplant coordination team and ongoing awareness initiatives.

The successful coordination and execution of this noble endeavor were made possible through the dedicated efforts of the critical care team under the leadership of Dr PL. Gautam, Professor and Head of Critical Care Medicine. All the liver transplants were skillfully performed by the liver transplant team, led by Dr Gursagar Singh Sahota, Chief Liver Transplant Surgeon. The Departments of Urology and Ophthalmology also played a crucial role, contributing their expertise to ensure the success of the overall process. This collaborative effort reflects the strength of multidisciplinary teamwork at DMC&H in advancing organ donation and transplantation.

DMC&H Endoscopy Vidyalaya

The Department of Gastroenterology, in collaboration with the Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy of India (SGEI) successfully organized the first-ever DMCH-SGEI Endoscopy Vidyalaya for DM Residents from various academic institutes nationwide at Ludhiana, marking a significant step in advancing endoscopic education. Hosted under the able guidance of Dr. Ajit Sood (Patron), Dr. Varun Mehta (Organizing Chairman), Dr. Ornesh Goyal (Organizing Secretary) and the executive committee of Dr. Ramit, Dr. Yogesh, Dr. Arshdeep and Dr. Monika, the event brought together budding gastroenterologists from across the country for a high-impact handson learning experience. A series of focused lectures on core endoscopic topics were



complemented by live demonstrations and hands-on workshops carried out with support of our skilled endoscopy staff and DM Residents fostering in-depth discussions and critical thinking. This first-of-its-kind academic event in DMC&H marks a promising beginning for structured, resident-led endoscopy education on a national scale—setting a benchmark for future programs across India.

CME on Glaucoma

Dayanand Medical College & Hospital, in collaboration with the Ludhiana Ophthalmological Society under the auspices of the Punjab Ophthalmological Society hosted a CME on 'Glaucoma Simplified: Preserving Sight Under Pressure'. Over 125 ophthalmologists participated in this insightful session led by Dr. Gurvinder Kaur, Professor & Head, Department of Ophthalmology. The Joint Organizing Secretary, Dr. Pallavi Singh, Vitreo Retina and Uvea Specialist, played a key role in coordinating the event.





Sensitization Workshop under ICMR Project

DMC&H in collaboration with Guru Angad Dev Veterinary and Sciences University (GADVASU), conducted a sensitization workshop under ICMR project titled 'Building a Surveillance Model for Detecting Zoonotic Spillover in Increased Animal-Human Interaction Setting Using a One Health Approach', for local slaughterhouse workers to educate them about the risks of zoonotic diseases. Dr Veenu Gupta, Principal Investigator of the project said that zoonotic infections are diseases that can be transmitted from animals to humans, and slaughterhouse workers are particularly at risk due to their close interaction with animals and animal products.

Punjab's First Intrauterine Blood Transfusion performed

DMC&H performed the state's first intrauterine blood transfusion on a 34-year-old pregnant woman whose fetus was diagnosed with severe anemia through advanced imaging and doppler ultrasound studies. A multidisciplinary team including Dr. Sushant Babbar Interventional Radiologist, Dr. Ashima Taneja Professor & Head Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Dr. Kamal Arora Professor Department of Pediatrics and The Department of Transfusion Medicine, executed this life-saving procedure.



CONSTELLATION Vision System for Vitreo-retinal surgeries

The Department of Ophthalmology, proudly inaugurated the state-of-the-art CONSTELLATION Vision System, a cutting-edge platform designed for advanced vitreoretinal surgeries. With the addition of this ultra-modern equipment, DMC&H has become one of the very few centers in the region to offer advanced and comprehensive retinal care with sutureless 25G and 27G vitrectomies.



Launch of Two New Clinics

Department of Pediatrics, DMC&H has launched two new clinics to support children's health and development. The 'Kawasaki Disease Clinic', held every second Saturday from June, focuses on early diagnosis and treatment of Kawasaki Disease to prevent serious heart complications. Project 'ROSHANI' launched to Combat Childhood Blindness

Department of Ophthalmology and Community Medicine, DMC&H in collaboration with SEVA Canada and Dr. Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital, Delhi launched Project 'ROSHANI' a paediatric ophthalmology initiative aimed at eradicating preventable childhood blindness across Punjab. Dr Priyanka Arora, Project Head & Professor Department of Ophthalmology, DMC&H shared that ROSHANI is an initiative by DMC&H dedicated to preventing childhood blindness by ensuring early detection, treatment, and awareness of paediatric eye conditions, especially in underserved rural areas.



Upgradation of Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) with Advanced Equipment

DMC&H, Ludhiana has enhanced its neonatal and pediatric services through advanced and specialized clinical programs. These initiatives include the installation of state-of-the-art equipment such as Portable Otoacoustic Emissions (OAE) for newborn hearing screening, Giraffe Hybrid Incubator and Radiant Warmer, Amplitude EEG for newborns with asphyxia



and seizures, a servocontrolled therapeutic hypothermia system at Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).



DMC&H Managing Society, Ludhiana has announced a scholarship programme worth over 6 crores for the MBBS, Nursing and Para-Medical students for the academic year 2025–26 to promote and nurture inclusive and merit-based medical education in Punjab. This first-of-a-kind initiative by a private medical institution in the state aims to make medical education more accessible to those who are deserving but without the necessary means.

Expert Q&A Guide to Vitreoretinal Surgical Practice

What is vitreoretinal surgery and what are its common indications?

Vitreoretinal surgery is specialised ophthalmic surgery performed to treat diseases involving vitreous body and retina. The purpose of vitreoretinal surgery is to restore, preserve and improve vision for a wide range of conditions. Common indications are rhegmatogenous retinal detachment, diabetic retinopathy complications including tractional retinal detachment and vitreous hemorrhage, macular hole, epiretinal membrane, intraocular foreign body and endophthalmitis.

What are the common techniques used in vitreoretinal surgery?

Vitrectomy is the most common surgical approach. It involves removing the vitreous gel to access the retina and treat various conditions. Pneumatic Retinopexy: Injecting a gas bubble to close retinal breaks in certain types of retinal detachments. Scieral Buckling: A technique where a silicone band is placed around the eye to help reattach a detached retina.

Is the surgery painful and how long does recovery take?

The surgery is usually not painful as it's done under local or general anesthesia. Post-operative discomfort is typically mild and manageable with medication. Visual recovery depends on the condition being treated but typically takes several weeks. Full healing may take a few months.

With the introduction of 25G and 27G instrumentation, vitrectomies are now sutureless and have faster recovery.

What are the post-operative care instructions after retina surgery?

Post-surgery care varies depending on the procedure but generally includes: Positioning: For procedures like macular hole repair, patients may need to maintain a face-down position to facilitate healing. Eye protection: Wearing an eye shield or patch for protection. Medications: Administering antibiotics, anti-inflammatory drugs, and corticosteroids as prescribed to prevent infection and reduce inflammation. Follow-up visits: Frequent follow-up visits to monitor healing, check for complications like retinal re-detachment, and assess visual recovery.

How does the success rate of retina surgery vary?

Success rates depend on the type of surgery and the underlying condition: Retinal detachment surgery: Success rates are typically around 85–90% in cases of recent detachment, but this can be lower in cases with multiple breaks or complex detachments with chronicity and glant retinal tears. Macular hole surgery: Success rates are about 80–90% for closure, but final visual outcomes depend on the size of the hole and pre-existing macular damage. Diabetic retinopathy surgery: Outcomes depend on the stage of disease, macular perfusion and the presence of other comorbidities like cataracts or glaucoma.

When does a diabetic retinopathy patient require surgical intervention? Diabetic retinopathy is the leading cause of blindness in the world and can lead to vitreous hemorrhage, retinal detachment, and macular edema. Vitrectomy is often performed to remove blood from the vitreous cavity and clear the visual axis. Membrane peeling is done to remove vasoproliferative tissue (epiretinal membranes) that can distort vision and cause tractional retinal detachment. Laser photocoagulation is used to treat diabetic macular edema or prevent further retinopathy progression intraoperatively.
